# Chip's Chat-



Planning assumes control of your environment – preparation involves training, intuition, and instinct. Let's stop writing so many plans that never get followed and let's start preparing our people for the competitive environment that they will battle in every day.

I love fall. It is the time of year that gets us thinking about the oncoming winter weather. We develop a plan for living through the winter and we make preparations. For example, we prepare for winter by bringing in the lawn furniture, disconnecting our garden hoses, replace the screen on our screen doors with glass, maybe clean our fireplaces, and the list goes on.

In my first career, we used to say "failure to plan means you plan to fail."

We plan and prepare something nearly everyday or even moment. We plan to go to the grocery store and prepare by making a list of the things we need. We plan to fill our cars with gas and we prepare by taking the car to the gas station and removing the gas cap. We plan our future careers and prepare to enter our chosen field through preparation in education and training.

I think you get the point. But I ask, how do we plan or prepare our faith? Do we need to? How do we prepare for the Lord's Second coming?

Let's start by finding out what the Bible says about planning. The Bible is full of people planning. There are Bible verses about God's plan. Scripture references about preparation and Biblical reasons to be prepared.

God, himself, is a planner. Look at the creation story in Genesis. Even after the fall, God had a plan for our salvation through Jesus Christ. Look at the detailed instructions he gave to the "Heroes" of the Bible. Do we not believe that God has a plan for our lives?

There are many examples of the Bible heroes having created God-inspired plans. In fact, God is actually in the middle of our planning. The best plans come when we rely on the Holy Spirit to guide us.

The scripture references in the Bible are plentiful regarding planning. Here are a few

- Proverbs 16:3 Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established.
- Proverbs 16:9 The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps.
- Proverbs 15:22 Without counsel plans fail, but with many advisers, they succeed.
- Proverbs 19:21 Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the Lord that will stand.
- Psalms 20:4 May he grant you your heart's desire and fulfill all your plans!
- Acts 2:23 This Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men.
- Luke 9:51 When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem

Luke 14:28-30 – For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete

it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.'

But how do we prepare and work on our faith? I believe the first step is to improve our relationship to the Lord. In a CD by Chuck Swindoll entitled "Intimacy with the Almighty," Swindoll says:

"There are steps we need to take in the process. He says we should strive for Simplicity, Silence, a Solitude which leads to Serenity, to humbly Surrender by saying "I want the Father's will for my life."

Intimacy with God is the closest of all relationships. It is when and where you can be blatantly honest, completely open, able to share your deepest fear or your most frightening thoughts without shame of risk of rejection. It is at the heart of a personal relationship with God. It doesn't just happen; you must work for it.

As we continue in improving our relationship to the Lord, we must also do some preparation. The way in which a person comes to anything demonstrates the spirit in which they come. We learn in Ephesians 6:11-13 we must prepare daily:

<sup>11</sup> Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. <sup>12</sup> For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. <sup>13</sup> Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand.

In addition, we must put on the garments of the mind and heart of the soul. WE put on the garment of expectation, humble penitence, faith, and reverence.

Finally, we need silence to listen to the Holy Spirit. I will close this month's article with a prayer found in a book by Henri Nouwen entitle "A Cry for Mercy." I think this is a wonderful prayer that illustrations the type of "Intimacy with the Father" we should strive to achieve. May God bless you as you make plans and preparations in your faith journey.

### **Word Out of Silence**

O Lord Jesus, your words to your Father were born out of your silence. Lead me into this silence, so that my words may be spoken in your name and thus be fruitful. It is so hard to be silent, silent with my mouth, but even more, silent with my heart. There is so much talking going on within me. It seems that I am always involved in inner debates with myself, my friends, my enemies, my supporters, my opponents, my colleagues, and my rivals. But this inner debate reveals how far my heart is from you. If I were simply to rest at your feet and realize that I belong to you and you alone, I would easily stop arguing with all the real and imagined people around me. These arguments show my insecurity, my fear, my apprehensions, and my need for being recognized and receiving attention. You, O Lord, will give me all the attention I need if I would simply stop talking and start listening to you. I know that in the silence of my heart you will speak to me and show me your love. Give me, O Lord, that silence. Let me be patient and grow slowly into this silence in which I can be with you. Amen.


