Chip's Chatter

During my 15 years as a commercial airline pilot, I was "on the road" 18 to 19 days per month which translates to 18 to 19 nights in a strange hotel. My first activity in arriving in my room was to try to find a radio station that was part of the Moody Bible Institute. I sometimes had to strain to listen to a very weak signal, but when I did, I received some wonderful teaching and peaceful music to aid in sleep. I tried to listen to Dr. Charles Stanley, or Dr. David Jeremiah, or Bishop T. D. Jakes, or Dr. Tony Evans. When I listened, I would often take notes on their messages, usually on those small pads of paper placed in the hotel room. I still have those notes. This month I will let you read those notes, just as I listened. There are some great life lessons for all of us.

Prayer

Prayer is my recognition of my dependence on God

Lay it out before God Begin the day with a depend-

ence on God

Walk through the day together

with God

God's power is released through prayer and that person's life

Ask God to empower your life "I need your power today."

Prayer is the channel of God's resources and blessings

God wants to increase your

blessing

God is waiting on you

God's will - Finding God's will

We know God's will instinctively (Jer 31:33, Romans 1:32 & 2:14)

Our conscience is our guide (Job 27:6, Acts 24:16)

God's will is in the Bible (2 Timothy 3:15-16)

It makes us wise for salvation, teaches us, rebukes us, corrects us

It also trains and equips us Pray for it....then listen (Luke 22:41,

Matthew 6:10, 1 John 5:14)

Failure to listen hinders God's

reply

Prayer is conversation with God.

Ease up!

How to handle disappointment

Don't be quick to judge the conduct of the person who has disappointed you.

Seek God's will before making a decision or to respond. (God is not silent)

Trust God's guidance. What He says may be different from what other say.

It will work out His higher pur-

pose

Ask God for what to do Respond in a manner that is best for the other person

Without accusation, without embarrassment, without seeking revenge Look for God's higher purpose in your life

Ask "God, what are you teaching me or what is the purpose?"

It gets your eyes off the disappointment or person

This gets your eyes on to God and the Cross (forgiveness)

Make a decision based on the Holy Spirits guidance not the other person's opinion

Do exactly what God tells you.

Anticipate a blessing from God in your disappointment

People will disappoint you, but Jesus never will

Learn to accept rather than control

Crisis or Spiritual Crisis

God has the right to interrupt our lives at will

God interrupts your life in order to accomplish His pre-determined plan

When God interrupts, it seems as if He's turned against us

You may never fully recover or forget the trauma

But you must remember 4 things

They are not interruptions, they are Divine interventions

God want to use you for His

plan

God's interruptions are redemptive. God is trying to bring someone to Him

Remind yourself, "God, you have chosen me to use me."

The interruptions are very often

painful

God is willing to make us suffer in order to reach someone who is not His child When God interrupts, it is worth it Every tear will be wiped away (Luke 1:38)

How do we know it is God?

My responsibility is to no figure it out, but to respond

Our prayer is to respond in the way God wants to use us We should ask "What is the pain trying to teach me?"

To some problems you mut accept the fact that the solution is no solution
No matter what happened in your childhood, at some time you must assume responsibility

One final thought - Think about it

So friend, when your nights are filled with loneliness

And your days are dark with discouragement –
When you can't seem to read or pray
or to do anything else –
Just sit still and let God love you.

As the gloomy days of winter disappear into our rear- view mirror, use these teaching points to help focus on new life that comes with Spring.
