I shared with him I had moved from Grand Forks to Bloomington, MN the summer between my Junior and Senior year of High School. He then told me he had experienced the same thing, at the same time in his life. He asked me how did I handle it. Well, I told him I was excited about it and looked at the move as a great adventure. By this time in life, my only sibling was married and on his own. That left my mother, father, and me to make this transition. For this other pastor, his move was a disaster ending up with some sad feelings.

All too often, we get our emotions all wrapped up with change. We immediately start to focus on the negative impact the change may have on our lives. Taking this approach tends to block out any positive that may be contained within the change. We start to make excuses which might even amount to not accepting or doing the things that must change. Sometimes, through introspection and prayer, we realize a need to change something in our lives. Again, it may lead to a joyous experience, or it can amount to some struggle before the change to a better life is complete.

I often quote a man named Zig Ziglar during funerals as families are facing a tremendous change in their lives. I discovered Zig Ziglar when viewing some DVDs as part of a ministry in which I was working. Ziglar was providing his testimony following the death of his own daughter at a young age. Even in the midst of that dramatic change, he found tremendous peace and used the experience to witness to people. I found this article on the internet about Zig Ziglar and include it here. He provides us with some extraordinary advice.

"Zig Ziglar died today at age 86. A World War II veteran, Zig Ziglar became the top sales person in several organizations before striking out on his own as a motivational speaker and trainer. With a Southern charm and lessons grounded in Christianity, Ziglar wrote over two dozen books and amassed a following of millions who were encouraged by his lessons for success.

Below are 10 quotes from Zig Ziglar that have the power to completely change the direction of one's life.

- 10) "Remember that failure is an event, not a person."
- 9) "You will get all you want in life, if you help enough people get what they want."
- 8) "People often say motivation doesn't last, Neither doesbathing--that's why we recommend it daily."
- 7) "There has never been a statue erected to honor a critic."

- 6) "People don't buy for logical reasons. They buy for emotional reasons."
- 5) " Expect the best. Prepare for the worst. Capitalize on what comes."
- 4) "If you go looking for a friend, you're going to find they're scarce. If you go out to be a friend, you'll find them everywhere."
- 3) "A goal properly set is halfway reached."
- 2) "your attitude, not your aptitude, will determine your altitude."
- 1) "If you can dream it, you can achieve it."

When change comes along in our lives, as it most certainly will, maybe it is best to focus on the positive part of the change. Then, embrace it and be ap peace. Remember, change can also become a great adventure.
